

Threave Castle in Kirkcudbrightshire Bronze, 14 or 15th century

- Made of iron, copper alloy or bone
- Two types of eyes:
 - Split and soldered
 - Punched (drilled for bone)
- Farlier needles -
 - More often iron
 - Eye types are equally distributed
- Later needles -
 - More often copper alloy
 - Eye is more often punched
 - · Bone is not found



Needlecases:

- Norse used copper alloy or bone
- Middle years used copper alloy or pewter
- Later years included wood
 - Sharpening tools are required
 - Cleaning cloth to keep tarnish at bay

PINS

- Metal pins are common finds
- Used for clothing attachments for sure
- Used for sewing purposes, probably
- Need to be stored and cared for just as needles

THREAD

Bobbins can bring your kit to the next level

- Norse people liked flat reels, in bone and wood
- Middling periods used bone and wood spindle like reels
- Later period liked to combine the thread spools and needles cases

- Linen thread needs to be waxed.
- Embroidery floss ends benefit from conditioner or wax

THIMBLES

Shapes include:

- Domes
- "Thimble shaped"
- Ring

- Most commonly made from bronze,
 - cast and sheet are equally represented
- Iron exists as well
- Embroidery doesn't mix with thimbles, instead, use modern adhesive finger protectos

SNIPS & SCISSORS

- Shears, snips and scissors have been found in all areas in all ages
- Most often made of iron, only occasionally silver.
- Often had a case of some sort
- Two types: Spring and pivot
- Shape hasn't changed much over the centuries



- Cat is required

- Sewing tools are shown in open baskets
- Bent-wood boxes appear in illuminations, often in women's bed chambers
- Covered baskets existed


